Introducing the Derbyshire All Age Carers Support Service

In April 2024, Derbyshire Carers Association introduced the Derbyshire All Age Carers Support Service on behalf of Derbyshire County Council and the Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care Board.

The new all-age Carers service has been designed to deliver the Derbyshire Carers Strategy by ensuring Young Carers, Young Adult Carers and Adult Carers have access to preventative, timely, appropriate and person-centred support.

Features of the new Derbyshire All Age Carers Service include:

Early identification and support

To promote early identification and encourage Carers to self-identify, we will raise awareness of the caring role, the rights of Carers and the support that is available at an individual, organisational and strategic level.

Healthcare Liaison will deliver support, advice and training to health service teams to improve the way Carers are identified and supported.

Information and advice

Carers can access information and advice in a variety of methods that is accessible and appropriate for their needs. This includes our Carer Helpline, online resources and learning programmes.

Carers will be well informed throughout their caring journey about the support available to them in their role, their rights and how to support their individual wellbeing. Learning sessions will include 'new to caring' and 'planning for the future' workshops.

Recognising and supporting Carers in the wider community

We will develop quality partnerships across all communities to proactively identify, connect and support Carers, and ensure the service supports a diversity of communities.

Our network of Carer Champions from across all sectors and communities will receive ongoing support and resources to identify and connect Carers from hidden and diverse communities.

Involving Carers as experts

All age Carers will be involved in the design and evaluation of the service through our Carers' Voice project. We will consult with Carers on issues which are important to them and share our findings and recommendations with partners.

Services and systems that work for Carers

Locality teams will support Carers to navigate and connect with services for themselves and the person whom they care for. Through affiliation with Carefree and the Carers Trust, we will help Carers access resources and a break from caring.

The Derbyshire County Council Carer Liaison Worker will be integrated within our team to ensure a cohesive, consistent, whole family practice between Adult Social Care, Children's Services, and the Carer service.

Carer employment and financial wellbeing

Our Carers in Employment programme will support workplaces and promote best practice in relation to their own workforce who are Carers. We will introduce employer training and quality awards. We will host monthly legal and financial clinics and explore ways to promote income maximisation for all Carers.

Innovation

Through local, regional and national networking and our established partnership with the University of Derby, we will continually explore best practice and how this can be integrated within services in Derbyshire. We will source additional income for new areas of work that will be co-produced with Carers.

Reducing inappropriate caring pressures that may have an impact on a child or young person's development.

This service is kindly provided by Legal Advisors on behalf of ABG Solicitors, who are authorised and regulated by the Solicitors Regulation Authority. The clinics are held twice monthly, and Carers can book a complimentary 30-minute telephone or in-person consultation with a solicitor to discuss various issues, including:

Who We Are

Carefree is a multi-award-winning digital charity with a mission to offer every full-time unpaid carer in the UK the chance of an annual short break.

What You Need to Know

Breaks consist of 1-2 night hotel stays, plus breakfast at the cost of a £33 admin fee.

To be eligible, you must be 18+ and a full-time unpaid carer (30+ hours per week).

The break is for the carer only. You are welcome to take a companion but not the person(s) you care for.



Carers may book up to one break per calendar year.

The Accelerating Reform Fund (ARF) Project

provides an opportunity for Derbyshire Carers Association to work closely with Carers to share ideas and co-design new technologies that will connect them to support in ways that look quite different to what has gone before the COVID-19 Pandemic. Also, the aim is to use technology in innovative ways to meet the needs of new Carers and accessing Carers' Assessments.

## Updating the All-Age Derbyshire Carers Strategy across 2025

The Derbyshire Carers Strategy 2022 – 2025 sets out to support the health and wellbeing of Carers and reduce the health and financial inequalities they experience while caring.

#### It currently focuses on 8 priorities:

- Improving Carer health and wellbeing
- Information and advice
- Carer employment and financial wellbeing
- Early identification and support
- Services and systems that work for Carers
- Young Carers
- Involving Carers as experts
- Recognising and supporting Carers in the wider community

As the landscape affecting Carers continues to change, the County Council will lead on reviewing these priorities with Carers, to take account of these changes and challenges, and ensure the next Carers Strategy continues to reflect what is important to Carers and where joint resources should be concentrated.

- Chat about how supported you feel by Health & Social Care services
- Discuss what's working well; areas for improvement and gaps in Carer Support
