The first of April 2015 ushered in a landmark Act of Parliament that has enshrined into law new rights for carers. The Carers association of course welcome this but is anxious to ensure there is sufficient resource and capacity in Derbyshire to meet the demands and needs of the nearly 130,000 carers in our County.

The new Act entitles carers to receive an annual carer's assessment from the local authority or from whom it has delegated this responsibility to. In Derby City I am pleased to inform you that the Carers association has been entrusted with this by winning a competitive tender from Derby City Council. We will also continue to perform this important function in the County of Derbyshire together with other Voluntary organisations and Adult care at the County Council.

At a time of falling numbers of carers assessments being undertaken nationally this will be welcome news for carers in Derby City and Derbyshire since the Carers association has seen a 46% rise in the number of carers we support over the last 3 years. Local Authorities, Carers organisations and the NHS locally should be proud of this track record. Without us all working as a community of caring this would not have been possible.

We must not however be complacent, carers and the organisations that represent them will continue to provide a voice for the many thousands of individuals who continue to be voiceless and work tirelessly for their special "cared for" person. Without them the NHS and Social Care departments would be inundated by calls for help. The Carers association wants to help every carer receive a carer's assessment and if eligible help them or the person they care for receive the support they need and deserve. Do let us know your experience, we want to be your voice to help the NHS, local Councils, voluntary organisations and of course the Association to continue helping you in your caring role.

I hope to see many of you during carers' week in June, do look out for events near you.

THE CARE ACT 201

NEW CARE ACT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CARERS

From April 2015, the Care Act introduces a new, national eligibility criteria for carers. A carer assessment will be carried out to determine eligibility for access to all carer support.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CARERS IS BASED ON IDENTIFYING AND MEETING THREE CRITERIA:

- Do the needs arise because the carer is providing necessary care and support?
- Is the carer's physical or mental health affected or at risk of deteriorating, or is the carer unable to achieve any of the listed outcomes?
- Is there consequently a significant impact on the carer's wellbeing?

The Care Act refers to **outcomes**, which are the ways a person will be supported to live their life and achieve what they want. The overall aim of all the support available is to help carers meet their needs and achieve the outcomes that matter to them, which in turn, will promote their wellbeing.

All carers assessment will consider the impact that the caring role is having on a carers ability to achieve the following outcomes:

- Carrying out any caring responsibilities the carer has for a child;
- Providing care to other persons for whom the carer provides care;
- Maintaining a habitable home environment in the carer's home;
- Managing and maintaining nutrition;
- Developing and maintaining family or other personal relationships;
- Engaging in work, training, education or volunteering;
- Making use of necessary facilities or services in the local community; including recreational facilities or services;
- Engaging in recreational activities.

Carers can be eligible for support whether or not the adult for whom they care for has eligible needs.

CALLING ALL CARERS

It is crucial for carers to find out what's available to them in light of changes to the Care Act. It is estimated nationally that millions of carers do not claim benefits and support they are entitled to. Our team will equip carers with knowledge, information and resources to take away and put into everyday life as a carer. Talk to us about the new Care Act, carer assessments, support group dates in your area, flexible working, benefit advice, pamper days, days out, respite, signposting, advocacy and local partnership support.
